

- Grants fund innovative practices that improve student achievement and growth
- School districts, non-profit organizations, and institutions of higher learning eligible to apply
- Three types of awards, ranging from \$4 million - \$50 million: scale-up, validation and development
- Deadline: August 2, 2011

- Fund comprehensive education, community and family services with effective schools at their centers , based on Harlem Childrens Zone
- Non-profit organizations and higher ed institutions that operate or partner with at least one targeted school eligible to apply
- \$30 million approved for FY 2011 budget
